




# Commander

In October it will be open to our membership and based on participation will continue through the 2018 -2019 season. The Next class is scheduled for TuesdayOct 23<sup>rd</sup> 9am till noon. This service is provided to us at no cost, but we are asking for a \$5 donation to cover the cost of our facility, refreshments, and baked goods. The class will be approximently 3 hrs normally from 9 AM to noon. The class will be limited to 24. Signup sheets will be available at the October general meeting or call the office. Certification cards will not be issued (a card never saved anyone but training does).





Seamanship started in September with classes on Monday/ Wednesday 7 to 9 PM Dan Patke (Lead)

Build boating confidence and competence for safe and fun on-the-water adventures. Seamanship provides a foundation of knowledge and skills in boat handling and maneuvering, boat operation, skipper's responsibilities, and boating techniques that will advance your boating enjoyment.



#### Junior Navigation is scheduled for October 1st Subject matter includes:

#### Ray Wlodkya (lead)

- Precise time determination
- Use of the Nautical Almanac
- Taking sextant sights of the sun
- Reducing sights to establish lines of position
- Special charts and plotting sheets for offshore navigation
- Offshore navigational routines for recreational craft

Electronic and computerized offshore navigation

In Junior Navigation, the student will continue to use GPS as the primary position sensor, as they learned to do in Piloting and Advanced Piloting. However, the offshore environment poses many different elements for consideration by the Navigator. Ocean currents, wind, and sea condition, all affect a vessel's performance over the longer passages.

Also, visible terrestrial landmarks are no longer available to the navigator as reference points. In the Junior Navigation course, the student will learn to substitute celestial objects such as the sun as reference points. The course begins with the study of celestial navigation, teaching the student to take sights on the sun with a marine sextant and derive a line of position from that observation. Next, the student will apply the principles learned in Advanced Piloting, and plot a running fix from two sun sights taken about four hours apart. Once the student has learned the basics of celestial sight reduction, the course continues with planning, positioning, and checking one's position in the offshore environment, using both electronic and celestial tools.

#### SAIL OCTOBER 9 2018 7 to 9 pm

#### It has been a number of years since we offered this course. Capt. Seaby (lead instructor) has many years of sailing experience

The course starts with basic sailboat designs and nomenclature, rigging, safety, and sail processes and then tackles the physical aspects of sailing forces and techniques sail applications, marlinespike, helmsmanship and handling of more difficult sailing conditions, navigation rules, and an introduction to heavy weather sailing. Appendices provide an introduction to sailboat racing and sailing in Canadian waters.

This new Sail course is a single volume Student and Instructor Manual (IM) developed in cooperation with the Canadian Sail & Power Squadron. Course instructional materials include material in Microsoft PowerPoint® format with embedded animations that require additional software to perform correctly

Course completion is documented by a closed book exam graded by USPS Headquarters.

#### **Piloting**

#### This course is offered Tuesday Oct 23, 7 to 9 PM Neil Pignatano Lead, (Jon Berning Assist)

Piloting is the first course in the seguence of USPS courses on navigation, covering the basics of coastal and inland navigation. This course focuses on navigation as it is done on recreational boats today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of traditional techniques so the student will be able to find his/her way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. Normally ten classes of two hours each are scheduled for presentation of this course. In addition the students have seven days to complete the open book exam. Topics covered include:

- Charts and their interpretation
- Navigation aids and how they point to safe water
- Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic
- Use of GPS typical GPS displays and information they provide, setting up waypoints and routes, staying on a GPS route.
- Pre-planning safe courses and entering them into the GPS
- Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techniques such as bearings and dead reckoning The "Seaman's Eye" – simple skills for checking that one is on course.

A number of us attended the District meeting educational seminar . Many changes are coming and we will keep posting those changes as they are implemented.

On-The-Water training Randy Headrick (lead) is gaining momentum if you are new or need a little refresher contact Randy see flyer in the Buoys.



First – Tommy is the right person to ask for at 813-645-2288. If it is more convenient people can email him at <a href="mailto:lhmarina@tampabay.rr.com">lhmarina@tampabay.rr.com</a>

You must be ready to provide all of your information. LOA – power needs – water – time/day in –time/day out – draft – beam - preference Port or Starboard tie.

There are 2 Marinas and a Sea Wall that are used for dockage.

- 1 For those who want to bring their boat but stay in a rented room ( Harbor Side ) and ( Little Harbor INN ) (LHI may be sold out ) they get a free slip along the Sea Wall. To get that slip however they must call the (Dock Masters) office ask for Tommy and he will assign you a slip. You must supply him with your room reservation number. The depth along the Sea Wall is 3-5 feet only.
- 2 Village Marina This is the first Marina they will assign slips to on a first come first serve basis for overnighters.
- 3 Antigua Cove This is the furthest away Marina and it is about a 10- 15 minute walk to the restaurant. You will know this location because of the high rise inside storage building.

Tommy will use this Marina for back up once he runs out of slips at Village Marina. Between Village Marina & Antigua he <u>hopes</u> to have about 25 slips available.


